








USING THE CORDLESS NAILER

- 1. Wear your protective equipment including goggles and ear defenders.
- Do not carry a loaded nailer around: unload 2.

- the fuel cell and battery first. To fix a nail, press the work-contact element 3
- against the workpiece, and pull the trigger. This equipment will drive two to three nails per second, or up to 500 per hour. Do not try to force it to work faster - it will damage
- the tool.
- When working close to the edge of your 5. timber take care not to split it.
- When you have finished work, unload and 6. clean the cordless nailer and store it and the fuel cells, battery and fasteners
